



Valued team member:

As part of the Christ Community Church Worship Arts Team, we all have a responsibility to act as “lead worshipers” for our church body. We are called to model biblical, true, and faithful worship of God while encouraging the church to do the same. While we are not expected to be invisible, we should do everything we can to move the attention from ourselves and toward Christ. Consequently, our attire is a valuable tool in achieving this goal. What we wear should be intentionally chosen to bring attention to God, and not ourselves. You are invited to be a team member in our worship services and productions because God has given you unique gifts that work together with those around you to serve as part of the church body. The leadership of the church greatly appreciates your sacrifices of time and effort, and requests that we all take part in the following dress code in order to fulfill all of the purposes above.

The goal is simple. We aim to avoid tempting or distracting others, instead portraying beauty, simplicity, and modesty. Of course, we encourage dressing according to our community and general fashion trends, but not at the expense of hindering someone from focus on Christ. The following are a few guidelines to point you in the right direction as a team member and “lead worshiper”:

- Appear groomed and clean
- Have a clean and natural smell (deodorant is encouraged, but please avoid perfume and cologne)
- Appearance should not call too much attention to the individual (avoid clothing or jewelry that is too flashy, provocative, or sloppy)
- Appropriate undergarments should be worn to keep body parts secure
- Clothing should not prominently display a logo (other than Christ Community Church specific designs)
- Shorts are not to be worn
- For men, a collared shirt is encouraged
- Holes in jeans—even fashionable ones—are discouraged
- The straps of sleeveless tops must be at least two inches wide
- Strapless dresses or shirts are discouraged
- Please do not reveal cleavage, even at those moments when leaning forward
- All dresses and skirts must not be shorter than the top of the kneecap
- Clothing should not be excessively tight or excessively baggy



- Pants that resemble the fit of tights require a top that comes below your bottom
- No flip flops or sloppy tennis shoes
